Here are some instructions about how to get...

### **...from Brussels airport to Ghent:**

There are trains from Brussels airport to Ghent, both direct ones and ones in which you need to change once, in Brussels North. Please check the following website if you wish to plan your journey: <http://www.b-rail.be/main/E/index.php>.

Train tickets can be bought at the ticket counters in Brussels.

Important: There are two stations in Ghent: Gent Dampoort and Gent Sint-Pieters. You should travel to Gent Sint-Pieters (Gand Saint-Pierre).

### **...from Ghent railway station to the venue:**

Take Tram 1 (every 6 minutes), get off at the 'Korenmarkt' (about 10 minutes). Walk over the bridge (Sint-Michielselling) and around the church (Sint-Michielskerk). The narrow cobbled street you see is Onderbergen. Het Pand is located in Onderbergen 1.



**...from anywhere in the centre of Ghent to the venue by car:**

Follow the P-route ('Parking route') to Parking P7 Sint-Michiels.

This car park is located at 50 metres from Het Pand. Take the exit 'Onderbergen' and you get out in the Wilderoosstraat, right across Het Pand.

Note: Even if you do not use a private car park, you have to pay to park your car in Ghent.

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
